# **Ethically challenging?**

Fellow Rotarian John Oxley was our guest speaker at our Rotary meeting this week. He convened a lively discussion on a range of ethical issues and we proved to be an ethical bunch of Rotarians. John referred us to a number of different sources as our ethical guides. He noted the ethical connections in the Rotary objectives, the Rotary Code of Conduct and the Rotary 4 way test, which he described as an ethical way to look at decision making. The scenarios that were discussed were thought provoking and realistic to a range of situations.

For example, here is just one that achieved a healthy discussion:

You're on the board of directors for a publicly traded corporation. You and your fellow board members, in hopes of heading off early for the holidays, rush through the investigatory process involved in a much anticipated merger. As a board member, you have a duty to exercise the utmost care respecting



decisions that affect the corporation and its shareholders. Failing to properly investigate a matter that affects their interests could be viewed as gross negligence supporting a breach of your ethical and legal duty of care.

One Rotarian observed that the discussion demonstrated the calibre of Rotarians in our club, including the depth of experience and responsibility hat have held or still hold. Well done John. If you missed the meeting, ask John for the scenarios and think about how you would respond.


### **Beatlemania** Last week, at the Golf
