Ray has been an Honorary Member for two years and in this time Ray has attended several of our club meetings & has been impressed with the fun & fellowship of our club & the efforts of Rotarians to make

our community & world a better place. Before the induction President Gil made a slight slip of

the tongue & spoke of Dr Ray's inducement which was very funny as he is a gynaecologist!!! Dr Ray Hodgson is a specialist gynaecologist in Port Macquarie & conducts regular surgical teaching sessions

in other hospitals throughout Australia, New Zealand & South East Asia. He is currently the conjoint senior lecturer in Gynaecology at the University of NSW.

The hospital plans were well underway until 18 months ago when an earthquake struck destroying 50% of the buildings

in Dolakha. Now Dr Ray is seeking to build a three-storey hospital which will include teaching facilities as well medical facilities.




Bill Nixon's 41 Years in Rotary

Recently Bill Nixon resigned from our Rotary Club & from Rotary after 41 years of service. Bill joined the Rotary Club of Chatswood (Sydney) in 1976 -1992 & served on the Board of this Club for five years. He then joined the Rotary Club of Byron Bay from 1992 - 2003 including two years as President 1995-96. & 1997-98 Then he moved to Nerang & was in this club from 2003 - 2012, In retirement, Bill transferred to the Rotary Club of Port Macquarie from 2012 - 2016.

'Young' Bill (top right) at **Camp Quality in Byron Bay** Over Bill's long history in Rotary he has thrown himself into many worthy community activities. During his time in Byron Bay, Bill has supported through Rotary, Camp Quality, school awards, open gardens, kidney transplant awareness, surf life saving, several exchange students, ships ahoy, a girl guides muster (similar to a scouts jamboree) and the local ambulance. The list goes on & on. PDG Paul Gillette once described Bill "as a one-man Rotary Club!" One of Bill's avenues of service was to be on the management committee & board of Katia Nursery in Byron Bay, which employed physically & mentally disabled young people.

In a citation (A Gift of Life) on Bill for the MDRT Foundation (Million Dollar Round Table Foundation) this was stated - Bill Nixon moved from the Rotary Club of Chatswood with a membership of 70+ members. When he arrived in Byron Bay the Rotary Club was in the doldrums - 9 members and little activity. Bill's enthusiasm and dedication touched the struggling club and in no time membership had

grown. The membership is currently 19 and club activities is at an all time high. (It is of interest that the club grew to 27 members). The project the club was seeking to obtain funds for was to assist a Community Retirement Village for the elderly. The project started as an extension of the existing building, but due to neighbouring land becoming the subject of a 'native title claim', a new building was required

some miles away at considerable additional expense. A grant of \$2500 was received.



Here at the Port Macquarie Rotary Club, Bill was involved in many of our club projects & was swamped with beanies & wool for Nepal. He was a joy and fun to have in our club. Always alongside Bill was his great mate, wife Gai. It is encouraging that Gai is continuing in our club as our International Director.
