# **Rotary Foundation** Bringing Good to the World

PDG Jo Wilkin gave a very inspiring talk & showed a DVD on the work of the ROTARY FOUNDATION as it celebrates it's 100th Anniversary.

The Foundation, a vision by World President Arch Klumph began in 1917 with a donation of \$26-50 from the Rotary Club of Kansas City. Over the past 100 years the Foundation has raised over 3 billion US dollars towards bringing good into the world.

The Foundation's largest aid project has been to remove POLIO from the world. This has almost been achieved with only 32 cases of polio reported this year in four countries.

The Foundation today gives money in two specific Categories - District Grants & Global Grants. For every dollar our District donates to the Foundation it is invested for 3 years & then half the money is given back to the district to be used in projects & the other half is

placed in the

District 9650 received \$185,000 which was used in grants by 41 clubs. To celebrate the Foundation's 100th Anniversary Jo has set-up a project PORTABLE WATER IN

Foundation's World Aid Fund. In the past year our INDIA & hopes to raise \$28,000 which will be added to make \$100,00 for clean water in India

#### CSU Students Red & Blue Ball Proceeds


