Oscar goes West (with the Tim Tams!!)


"We have said goodbye to Oscar for the time being."

Rotarian for 22 Years - Ted Townsend Dies at Age 90



On December 30th 2016, a former member of our Rotary Club Edward (Ted) Townsend died.

• Ted was the founding partner of a plumbing firm MOORE & TOWNSEND which still exists today.

• He was President of the Port Macquarie Rotary Club in 1962-63... the year of completion of the Port Macquarie Observatory. He was made a Patron of the Astronomical Society. During Ted's year as President the town had a devastating tornado that saw 3 workmen killed. Our club was at the forefront of supporting families devastated by the tornado. Ivan Meldrum (a member of our club) was District Governor at this time.

• Ted served numerous times on the club board in his 22 years, including Treasurer & Secretary.

• In 1975/76 Glen Fowler was our club President and in January '76 suddenly died. Ted stepped-up as President for the next five months.

- Then suddenly in the latter half of 1976, Ted resigned from Rotary. Why ?
- According to an article in the Port Macquarie News (Ted's picture above is from the paper 11/1/17) by Malcolm Andrews, Ted was also instrumental in the re-locating of the Port Macquarie Golf Course. He served in WW2 with RAAF & was a keen fisherman.
- Our Rotary club owes Ted Townsend a great debt for his efforts in the fledgling years of our club.
