Angel Flight

Tonight's guest speaker was Clyde Stubbs from Angel Flight. Clyde was introduced by Program Chair Lloyd Cross (Pictured with Clyde below right)

Clyde has been a pilot for 21 years & has made 38 angel flights since 2003. He now lives in Wauchope.

Angel Flights are available free of charge to people who are not sick enough for a Medivac, nor the Westpac helicopter service but have a non-emergency medical appointment, usually in a capital city & are unable to travel via car & can't afford the commercial airlines. Pilots with a passion to fly & a wish to help others, volunteer to fly. They give of their time & plane expenses & are only reimbursed for the cost of their fuel.

Angel Flight is a voluntary organisation totally run with donations (no-government assistance). As well as pilots there are also hundreds of Earth Angels, people willing to drive patients from the plane to hospital & back again.



What did they do? Debbie Loveday contacted & spoke to the Club President Michael Batt, these are some of things they

- Dispensed with the weekly meal no attendance figures necessary.
- Meetings were for ONE hour, no more. Keep the meeting productive. Young parents after the meeting concluded go home to put their children to bed. Older members often also go home.
- After the ONE hour meeting, members are asked if they would like to stay for dinner together. They pick a venue, give them a call & let the café/restaurant know they are coming.
- Most members wear their Rotary shirts out to dinner to be visible to the community. They vary the dinner venue each week.
- They have dispensed with Rotary Grace, & the National Anthem.
- Each member is allocated to a project. They report on these projects in the ONE hour meeting, if anything to report.
- One major fund-raiser (the Art Show) this committee meets outside of Rotary meetings & reports to the board.
 - They interact with other local clubs, eg Walcha.
- The club reaches out to Youth Groups in the town & involve young parents who want to see things done for their school. They join with Rotary to achieve their goals.
- Sounds radical, but a 300% growth in membership is impressive.
