How to Find the Wauchope Rotary Rooms?

- Turn left at the Cameron Street round-about (Royal Hotel on left-hand-corner)
- * Within 100 metres turn right into Oxley Lane (at the end of the shopping block on r/h/s)
- Drive to top of Oxley Lane & turn left into parking area between Rotary Club Rooms & Bain Park.

Note - you cannot turn left into Oxley Lane (one way) at the top of High Street, opposite the Post Office, but you could park in High Street & walk 200 metres to the club.

Three -on - Me with Dr Ray


Dr Ray Hodgson, recently spoke to 600 delegates at our District Conference on his work in Nepal with **Australians for Women's Health** & received a standing ovation. At last weeks meeting he shared some insight into his childhood -

Believe it or not, but Ray as a child was very shy & terrified of speaking in public. He was bullied & intimidated & struggled to stand-up for himself. Until one day when he was about 11 he challenged

the school bully. The bully-boy (also about 11) called Ray some derogatory names. The bully was surrounded by his 7 or 8 mates. Ray, in his usual timid style, simply wanted to run away from the scene and hide. But when he looked behind him he saw several of his own mates, all watching on eagerly for his response to the insults. Ray then faced the bully, and with all the bravado he could muster he said the only thing that came to his mind: "WHAT did you say?" The

bully took one step closer to Ray, and with hands on his hips shouted: "I NEVER REPEAT MYSELF." Ray stood there, still extremely uncomfortable, and still with no idea what to say. The only thing he could think of was to repeat his first question: "WHAT DID YOU SAY?" The bully again shouted: "I NEVER REPEAT MYSELF.....oh!" Riotous laughter all around from both Rays mates and the bully's. Suddenly, for the first time in his life Ray found he was the accidental hero.
