- Next week we will hear from our two RYLA candidates & other youth speakers with Diana Gammon.


## Rotary Lodge Extensions Opened

On Tuesday we celebrated the Official Opening of the extensions to Rotary Lodge by MP Leslie Williams. The two wings were named after Lodge pioneers Ron Walesby & Richard Marocco. Lodge Chairman Phil Haffey said that this was one of the biggest Rotary projects currently being undertaken in Australia. The Lodge now has 36 rooms with further extensions to cater for 48 rooms as the next development.

Only 8% of occupants of Rotary Lodge are locals, the rest come from outside our area. Families with family members needing hospital or cancer treatment. The Lodge is managed very well by Paula Johnson & she is supported by Phil Perry.

### End Trachoma by 2020

Tonight's keynote speaker was PDG Ian Dyball (pictured with Debbie Loveday, all dressedup for St Patrick's Day).

Ian gave a very professional presentation on the eradication of trachoma from Australia by 2020. Trachoma is a highly contagious bacteria infection that infects the eyes & can lead to permanent blindness. Amazingly, Australia is the only developed country in the world with this problem.




Mostly amongst our indigenous people in the outback.

Rotary is partnering with a number of other organisations, such as the Australian Trachoma Alliance, the Fred Hollows Foundation & the Australian Government, to tackle this problem found in aboriginal camps, mostly around Alice Springs & Northern South Australia & also at Leonora in Western Australia.

The Rotary partnership has identified ways that Rotarians can support some of our least advantaged Australians improve their health & wellbeing. SAFE (Surgery); A (Antibiotics); F (Facial cleanliness) & E (Environmental improvements) The E part of SAFE is the area Rotary can mostly help.

Some of the projects we can support - Installation of mirrors in homes. 1000s of 300mm stick-on mirror tiles are needed for every indigenous home/dwelling.\$15. - Face washers, personalised microfibre face washer for each child \$4; Soap Making - workshops for indigenous women, \$1500 for a 2-day workshop; Manual washing machines. Ezywash - cost \$100 & Installation of community laundry facilities with bathrooms & showers. For more info &
