
Anzac Cluster

The keynote speaker was Major Murray Gough who served for 46 years in the military, 24 in fulltime army service & 22 in Standby Reserve. Major Murray served in Vietnam (Vung Tau & Nui Dat), Malaysia, Papua New Guinea & many other locations. He taught at the Royal Military College Duntroon, HMAS Cerberus & established the PNG Defence Force College. A remarkable distinguished career in the military.



Major Murray prefaced his talk by saying he has not made a habit of speaking of his military experiences because of the split in his life between military & civilian . He has found this dichotomy difficult. He then went on to speak about some of his experiences in serving our country.

Julie Constable had her sister present from Gloucester & three of her four children who said they had never heard Uncle Murray talk about his military experiences before. Greg Laird our local RSL President discovered that he had served in Vietnam at the same time as Major Murray, but in different divisions.
