


The Story Behind the Hats!

Maintaining our Water Supply

Tonight our guest speaker was Terry Randall the Water Cycle Manager at the PMQ/Hastings Council (pictured with program Chair - Brian Calford) Terry gave us a detailed insight into how our water



supply works. Pumping water from the Hastings River into Cowarra Dam & then pumping to the Port Macquarie Reservoir & an intricate pipeline all the way down to Kendall. An amazing network of pipelines & storage reservoirs bringing us much needed water in very dry conditions. Our Council is to be commended for the efforts they have gone to & are doing to provide us with adequate water. A new pipeline is being constructed from Cowarra to near Bonny Hills & will circumvent water from the township of PMQ directly to the south.

At present the Hastings River is running as low as it has been for years & less water is being pumped in than is being pumped out of Cowarra Dam.

The dam is at its lowest with 50% capacity.

Another great initiative is recycling sewerage water. Much of this water is being used for industrial use, parks & gardens & also for pumping into flooding the peat-bog holes to reduce the smoke hazard in the Thrumster area. Another recycling plant is being installed at Cowarra so

flood water can be pumped into the dam.


Thanks Terry for some great insight & good to know we have such expert hands in charge of our water.
