

Heights Youth Outreach.

Leighton provides a safe environment, based on his faith, where people can express what is going on in their lives and work through their thoughts and feelings in an outdoor adventure setting.

Whether it be rock climbing, canoeing, skiing, fishing he is there supporting and mentoring our troubled Youth.

New Heights operates out of a shed in Hastings River Drive. Clients sponsored by the NDIS come to Leighton for help and support. Friday is free food night and a range of activities are planned for the evening. Leightons clients total about 40 young people.
