

Three-On-Me Sheila (Sam) Openshaw

Sam shared her remarkable story last week (here is an edited version) - I was one of eight children. We had a very humble upbringing, Mum and Dad had a 2 bedroom flat in Hewlett Street Bronte Sydney. We moved to Merrylands. Back in those days Merrylands was a great place to grow up, lots of fields and paddocks, certainly not like it is today.

I had a good education, attended Holy Trinity Girls School Granville where I completed my schooling and also became an Irish Dancer. I went in many Eisteddfods and won many medals for my Dancing. After completing High School I went on to further education at St. Patrick's Business College right in the heart of Sydney. I stayed at St. Pat's

for 2 years where I met some lovely girls, one of them being Margaret Hyde, Daughter of Frank Hyde. Frank Hyde MBE OAM was an Australian Rugby League Footballer, coach and radio caller. I did extremely well at St. Pat's topping Australasia

in Shorthand and Typing both in the Advanced Grades. I left Merrylands when I was 18 and moved out to Bronte Beach in the East to live with my Grandmother as my Grandfather had passed away and my Nan was on her own. I looked after Nan until she passed at the age of 98. In 1995 Alan and I relocated to Port Macquarie from the Eastern Suburbs of Sydney, I took up singing here in Port which I really loved and continued to do so for 2 years. During those 2 years my teacher and I started up a group of singers called the Rainbow Singers, it mainly was for children with disabilities.

Over the years I have taken away many people who experience mental ill health on camps down at Broken Bay on the Hawkesbury River, I did this on my own but once I arrived at the camp I had a lot of help. I manage an on-line news service, regularly posting information about mental health Research, events and services via broadcast email and Facebook. I have

been featured in a book of inspirational stories called "Turning Points" published by One Door Mental Health. A presentation was made to me by Australian of the Year 2010, Prof. Patrick McGorry and Founder of Headspace.

Some of my Achievements over the years:

In 1972 I was awarded Charity Queen in a quest for raising the most money for the Deaf & Blind Children, I raised over \$6,000 which was a lot of money back in those days. I am a Life Member of One Door Mental Health in Sydney, formerly known as the Schizophrenia Fellowship of NSW.

I am a Founding Member of Endeavour Clubhouse here in Port Macquarie which is a Rehabilitation and Recovery Centre for people experiencing mental ill health.

In 2012, I became a Hastings Heroine at the International Women's Day Awards in appreciation of my contribution to the Hastings Community.

In 2015 I was Awarded NSW Carer of the Year Also in 2015 I was made a Paul Harris Fellow, I am also a Companion of Australian Rotary Health and a Silver Friend.

In 2016 I was Awarded PMHC Citizen of the Year, this Award was mentioned in the State Parliament by Mrs Leslie Williams MP of which I have a copy of the speech. WELL DONE SAM.
