The Rotary team includes "grants specialists " – Rick Eller from Westport and Fred O'Toole from Port Macquarie who are looking for new grants. They work with Leanne Jeffrey, Community Liaison Officer from the College. The school has produced details of present needs for the grant applications.

This project is set up in isolation with the aim of sourcing new funds without impinging on the general aims of members of these very busy Rotary Clubs. - Diana Gammon.




Rotarian Craig Oversees the Arrival of the Covid Vaccinations for the Senior Citizens of Port Macquarie

The Bird Man from Alcatraz (oops) Port Macquarie!!!


Ted Giblin via ZOOM from Sydney gave us a fascinating talk on local bird life. Ted, who is a member of the Hastings Birdwatchers shared insights into the Birds of the Hastings. There are 317 different species of birds in this area, some in danger of extinction. Ted showed pictures of many of the fascinating birds found by the sea, on the continental shelf, inland in swamps & rainforests.



Some birds fly 1000s of kilometres from the Northern Hemisphere to come here for the winter months before returning to mate.

One of the great birdwatching spots is in the Sea Acres Rain Forest. Neil Porter suggested that the club look at a visit to Sea Acres & for Ted to lead us on a birdwatching tour. This was enthusiastically agreed by the members on ZOOM.

In Sea Acres there is Australia's largest owl that is known to consume one possum per day (365 possums per year). We should export these owls to New Zealand as they have a huge possum problem! Thanks Ted for a great presentation.
