The third keynote speaker at the recent Rotary District Conference was Dr Ray Hodgson, a specialist gynaecologist & Assoc. Prof. in Obstetrics & Gynaecology at the University of NSW. Ray is also the International Director of our club. He conducts medical tours into Nepal with an aid organisation he formed - Australians for Women's Health (A4WH), focussing on the appalling state of maternal health and genital prolapse in Nepal. Ray gave us a challenging update on his work & Rotary's support at the conference.

I've attached a few slides from the conference talk. I think the most important one is the slide (at right) with the fundraising graph. This shows the powerful effect that Rotary has had with our project. Rotary became involved in 2017, and soon after there were clear benefits from various Rotary contributions, including District and Foundation Grants. While the majority of funds raised are from private donations (not directly through Rotary), once Rotary became involved our organisation, A4WH gained more prestige. It gave many people confidence to donate to our cause.


The United States are coming on board too, with the creation of a platform over there to allow tax-deductible donations through Rotary in the US.

We need to raise a little over AUS \$1.5 million. This figure includes the costs of land, planning, engineering, construction and fitting out the hospital. Right now we've raised a little over AUS \$1.3 million – the end in almost in sight.

When I'm appealing to audiences to come on board with our Mothers & Babies Hospital project, I usually ask them to embrace the many challenges we all face along the way – to grab the challenges with both hands and to give this our best shot. I'm proud to say that individuals and Rotarians HAVE embraced these challenges, they HAVE grabbed them with both hands. My appeal now is: DON'T LET GO. Let's all keep a firm grip on to this, let's stay hanging on until we get our hospital up and running and independently self-sustaining. Let's show the world that as Rotarians we can make a major difference.
