Wallace, Joe Debenham, George Roberts, Cliff Gott and Max Starr, (and some I am sure I have forgotten) would collect a bundle and hand-deliver them to every Rotarian's letter-box in Port Macquarie & surrounds! O yes, they were the 'good olde days'!!!!!
