Lifeline Records Highest Daily Call on Record as Lockdown Exacerbates **Loneliness & Hardship**

Lifeline has recorded its busiest day ever, a sad outcome linked to Australia's current lockdowns. The support service saw Monday August 3 service 3,345 calls, which is the highest daily number in the organisation's history.

....... Suicide Prevention Australia CEO, Nieves Murray said the lockdowns had

raised tensions (but so far there has not been an increase in suicides) The recent lockdowns have significantly shifted the social and economic landscape and will exacerbate the risk factors that are clearly linked to distress such as economic hardship, employment, relationship breakdown and loneliness, particularly for young people.

..... Australians are being urged to reach out to anyone who may be struggling. Parents, grandparents and carers, are urged to find time for regular check-ins with the young people in their lives, particularly if you notice things don't seem quite right.






Memories of Paul's Rotary Days
