Tonight's guest speaker was Dr Nigel Urwin who recently semi retired as an adjunct senior lecturer in genetics at Charles sturt University. Nigel lives in Lake Cathie and is a member of the Rotary Club of Laurieton. Nigel spoke on 'Genealogical DNA tests and health information. Many people use genetic tests for family history studies (e.g. Ancestry DNA) In addition to the use of this information to study ethnicity and for identification of relatives it can be used to provide information on health. Examination of your raw data allows examination of your specific DNA variations associat-

ed with genetic disorders, such as hemochromatosis or genetic traits such as adverse responses to medicines, likelihood of addiction, or a predisposition to a range of other disease states. Nigel discussed ow we could do this ourselves and what the information means and its implications. He also discussed the implications of the use of such genetic information in the broader context for society in general. This was a very interesting insight to information that can be gleaned from our DNA. Nigel gave some very valid reasons why we might no want to know and the reasons for this. I believe we all found it extremely interesting and would like to thank Nigel very much for his time tonight.



This weeks spotlight is on President Frank Moxon.

I was born the second child of Frank & Rose Moxon of Londonderry NSW, Frank spent many enjoyable days exploring the 4 acres of bush on the property. By the age of 9 I had 2 brothers and a sister, for our education we moved to Mt Druitt which at that time was just a village. After finishing my primary education at Colyton PS I attended Rooty Hill High School, after gaining my School Certificate. Wanting to make my own way in the world, I joined the workforce in the clerical field. For 4 years I attended night classes at Penrith Technical College, from which I graduated with commerce qualifications. Having obtained the certificate I left the Egg Marketing Board and headed back to bush I loved so much, arriving in Barraba in 1971. At church I was to meet the love of my life Narelle, we were married in 1972.



Working in the accounts at the Woodsreef asbestos mine I could see there was no future in the continued operation of the mine, time to move. We left Barraba and settled in Tamworth working at a Building Society, before we left Tamworth I was on the audit team of the Education Department examining the financial record of 156 schools. In 1979 both Narelle and I received the call into Salvation Army Officership and went to Sydney with our 2 young children, and after 2 years of residential training. In 1982 we were commissioned and commenced 32 years of ministry in the following appointments (none of which were of our choosing), Lithgow; Wagga Wagga; Dubbo; Nambour; Armidale; Parramatta; Toowoomba; Collaroy Beach and finally Port Macquarie. It was during this time as an Officer I became a member of 3 Rotary Clubs.
