

Ray Hodgson -MAKING AID BETTER - Why we're making

things worse? Tonights guest speaker via Zoom, a doctor from Nepal was unable to join us, so our International Director, Dr Ray Hodgson stepped in and gave an amazing address on the troubles with aid to 3rd world countries.

Ray was very disturbed on the issue of Foreign Aid (80% of which comes from governments like our own) that miss the mark of enabling 3rd world countries to see a growth in their national GDP, but sadly instead, make people become dependant on 'hand-outs'! He gave several examples of how much of the world aid treats chronic diseases like emergency aid. When there is a crisis and people are in huge trouble, it is essential for world aid to pour in to assist. But this is not a good model for regular support of human aid.

Ray spoke of the way forward with Behavioural Economics; & Evidence Based Research. Ray gave three examples of how this is working in the challenges with Malaria and the use of bed nets (of which Rotary is at the forefront of promoting). He gave another example on Maternal Deaths from his experience in working in Nepal. The use of ultra sounds to break through paternal culture restrictions and seek treatment for pregnant women. He also gave an example of immunisation and the use of incentives to encourage people to seek immunisation for their children against measles, etc.

A great message Ray. Challenging for us all, but needs to be stated. Thanks.
