Guest Speaker tonight was David Pearson - Deputy Chair **RAWCS Ltd.**

Dave is a professional Geologist with a 25-year career in Mining and Mineral Exploration, working in every state of Australia, PNG and Indonesia before moving to Guyra in year 2000 to become a full time Grazier.


Dave joined Rotary 1992 with the Rotary Club of Sunnybank Hills in District 9630 and subsequently transferred to The Rotary Club of Guyra where he is a two times Past President. His District 9650 roles included founding Secretary of RYAG Sheep 2004 to 2007 and District Chair for Rotarians Against Malaria (RAM) 2012 to 2015. In 2015 Dave was appointed to the Board of RAWCS Ltd as National Manager for RAM and served in this role for four years. In

2019 he was invited to remain on the Board as Deputy National Chair. In addition to being an active member of the RAWCS Executive, he has taken the lead in organising the Rotary Drought Fodder Project, Drought Community Outreach Project and Chairs the RAWCS Philanthropy Committee.

Dave receives great support from his wife of 44 years Judi and together they have two Daughters and six Grandchildren.

Dave spoke about the volcanoes in the Indonesian area and how they form, together with the difference between regulated vs artisanal mining in PNG. Volcanoes areas are rich in valuable minerals. The regulated mine @ Gosowong is known as a bonanza mine producing 30 to 60 grms of gold per tonne of ore.

The fallout from unregulated mining was a lack of safety plus enormous environmental impact. Dave compared the unregulated mining to that of a 'wild



Breaking News! Following the board meeting last Wednesday, it was resolved that the club would support a flood relief project, in our area. We have partnered with the Rotary Club of Laurieton and the RACG program to provide Flood Recovery Relief to people impacted by the floods in March 2021. Many homes in our area were made uninhabitable after flood waters reached over 1.5 metres.. The RACG project committee will identify people who will, with this additional assistance, be able to return to their previous homes. Many of these people have



been relying on charity and friends for nearly 6 months. Club and other donations totalling \$10,000 will be matched by the RACG, enabling \$20,000 to be utilised to support these people in our communities. The Rotary Australia Compassionate Grants Program came into being when Dick Smith donated \$1

million dollars to aid Australians in necessitous circumstances. Since then Dick donated another \$1 million dollars to continue this good work. Bob Cleland and Debbie Loveday received the second cheque in Sydney a couple of years ago and most of this has now been spent.


