A family in Walcha has supported foster care children since 2016. Their eldest son Simon had observed that when the children arrived to be cared for they had almost nothing except the clothes they wore. He said for his ninth birthday that he wanted no presents for himself, but would like to get some items to put in a backpack to give to the foster children. He set about collecting items to fill the backpacks - such as soft toys, toiletries, pyjamas, underwear, textas, books and hand balls. His goal was to pack ten backpacks. But the community and

especially the **Walcha Rotary Club** stepped in to offer to assist Simon. By the end of last year Simon had collected and filled 200 backpacks and distributed them to foster care agencies in the New England area.

## Cotton-pickin' with Adam Kay

Tonight's guest speaker via ZOOM was the CEO of COTTON AUSTRALIA Adam Kay.

Adam has been the CEO since 2007 and his group represents the interests of



1500 cotton producers in NSW and QLD. Adam was a District Agronomist with the NSW Dept of Agriculture for 30 years, based at Warren. Prior to Cotton Australia, Adam was GM of Cotton Seed Distributors at Wee Waa for 11 years. He has won a number of industry awards and also been awarded a Churchill Fellowship.

Adam gave us a very enlightening talk on the state of the cotton industry in Australia. 90% of cotton is grown on family-owned farms. Cotton Australia supports & advocates for them. Cotton provides 12,000 jobs and contributes over \$3 billion to the Australian economy. Despite crippling droughts and the loss of the China market, the industry is seeking new markets in Asia and with good rains expecting a bumper crop this year. Many manufacturers of cotton garments both overseas and home here in Australia are seeing how good the local cotton product is.

Since 1992 the cotton industry has made huge advances with environmental issues. Today it uses 48% less water and amazingly has reduced its use of insecticides by 97% thanks to genetically modified cotton being developed with a strong resistance to insects and other cotton crop destroyers. An experiment is also being carried out near Goondiwindi in shredding waste cotton garments & putting them back into the soil to rejuvenate it.

Adam answered a number of questions from members, but all were greatly impressed with his presentation. It is clear that the Cotton Industry needs to continue to tell their story, so the community can get a better chance to evaluate the value of growing cotton in Australia (from Emerald in Qld to Swan Hill near the bottom of the NSW border).
