He was not an upfront Rotarian but would repeatedly put his hand-up whenever there was a job to be done. He received a 'standing ovation' at the 1970 District Conference for DG Roger Dulhunty when he supervised the erection and pulling down of a huge margue seating 500 people on the Town Green. He was also involved in the construction of the Port Macquarie Race Track. He led an army of volunteers, who in the space of 18 months, transformed swamp-land into a top racing track that is one of the most outstanding on the North Coast today.

Each year in October the race club runs a race in his honour -
