

A Message from President Frank -

I believe the decision to not meet in person until March was a wise one. I understand that meeting via Zoom is not ideal but it does give opportunity to share together with interesting speakers.

We are living in a state of flux which has necessitated plans being changed to best suit the situation. I understand for some are uncomfortable with this but at some point we will achieve a measure of normality.

Some of the changes we need to make are because of situations beyond our control. Toward the end of last year Panthers introduced additional charges for ancillary services like tablecloths. To adjust to this additional cost a survey was taken of members of 13 alternatives allowing for the preference of 4 meeting formats.

First preference results were

33% of members accepted and increase to meal charges to \$28 option 5 21% to have less dinner meetings option 3

17% to have an hours business meeting and optional meal elsewhere option 7

However, in the process of reviewing the results taking into account 2nd to 4th choices where 1st preferences were weighted with a value of 4, 2nd - value 3, etc. the results were different.

These results were

Option 7 weighted score of 47 Option 5 weighted score of 40 Option 3 weighted score of 31

Compounding as to which was the right choice news was received this week that Panthers will set the minimum charges of attendance at 20. This will mean if less than 20 are in attendance the club will be charged for 20 meals. This will make option 5 insufficient if attendances are below 20.

Whilst we are in this state of flux I am supporting Debbie's suggestion that our program be set to try out these options.

Mar 30th – Social Night.
