An estimated 5.9 million children under the age of 5years, die each year because of malnutrition, inadequate health care and poor sanitation—these can be prevented. Women are taught how to prevent mother to infant HIV transmission, how to breast feed, and how to protect themselves and their children from dis-

Paediatric Unit Upgrade PMBH—Our club has partnered with President Steve Towle of the Rotary Club of Port Macquarie West to support the proposed upgrade to the Paediatric ED Unit being established at PMBH. The cost of the project is \$65,000. Bob Cleland has initiated an application to the RACG (Rotary Compassionate Grants program to match \$15,000 donated by our cluster Rotary Clubs. The objective is to provide artwork and to repaint the unit with bright colours. The current clinical white walls provide a negative experience for kids arriving in the Emergency Department. Children being brought to the ED together with their parents will receive more effective treatment with the distraction of this artwork and colour. They



will feel separated from the usual trauma associated with a Hospital's ED experience.

Apr 27th Zoom meeting with President Henry Nsamba of the Rotary Club of Kampala Kawempe—will showcase the work being done in support of the Malaria Project. Our club has partnered with this club in Uganda. We received a district grant of \$4000 and our club put in \$600. Other monies have come from Uganda. The first phase of the project has been completed and we will receive an update of what has happened in April.
