Foundation Bricks for new Hospital in Nepal

On April; 25th, in a colourful ceremony Dr Ray Hodgson & DG David Mayne laid the Foundation Bricks for the Mother's & Babies Hospital in Dolakha in Nepal.

This hospital has been seven years in the making with Rotary being supportive for the past four years. Dr Ray shared the excitement at last night's Rotary meeting, thanking Rotary for it's support and especially the support of PDG Debbie Loveday & DG David Mayne.

Ray was exhausted after only arriving back in Australia at mid-night on Monday night. Having been absent from Nepal for two years, he was swamped with urgent operations for women with genital prolapse & pregnancy. Ray also told us of a new innovation with Micro Pathology, sending blood samples on-line elsewhere for analysis. This is a great innovation for remote hospital health. It is hoped the new hospital building will begin in a few months.

This program is re-opening provided the pandemic and government regulations allow this to occur. Outbound students must be in year 9,10 or 11 to be eligible and will be required to return to secondary education in Australia for at least one scholastic year. 
