#### The Little Things

Two weeks ago, we listened to President Henry Nsamba, from the Rotary Club of Kampala Kawempe, Uganda, give an update on our Malaria Project. During that presentation we were confronted by the vision of a disabled lady who had to crawl into the clinic to receive her malaria net, food, and second-hand clothes.

We would have missed it, if we blinked, went to the bathroom, or were distracted for a few seconds. I guess most of us were appalled at the sight of this poor lady, in such an undignified position.

We know we can't fix all the world's problems, but sometimes it's the little

things that have a major impact. At last year's conference Peter Baines said, "It is not alright to do nothing – start something" President Henry was contacted for more information on the lady.

It was decided that we would purchase a wheelchair for this lady. Given that most of the ladies in this slum area make money to survive by prostitution, we knew this lady had few options. A sewing machine would enable her to make clothes that could be sold, thus making her more self-sufficient.

We hope that she can teach others to sew and get a group of women together to make this a sustainable project.

Women's skills centres are not new to Rotary. We have all been inspired by Stephanie Woollard and her work In Nepal with seven disabled women.

In this Rotary year where RI President Shekhar Mehta asks us to empower women and girls, this story goes a long way to increasing our impact and expanding our reach to provide service that changes lives, one life at a time. Years ago, PDG Neville Parsons said, "Rotary is, what Rotary Does", in other words, you can tell people about Rotary, but a better way is to show them what Rotary does.

Only by sharing our stories no matter how small will we raise our public image and inspire others to be a part of Rotary too.


