We knew that the time would come when we would receive "Farewell Order" to leave for a new location. Sometimes this was extremely difficult when we felt that our work was not finished. Looking back now we have seen that many times

As my year as your President draws to a close and I raise the baton up to place in the hands of PDG Debbie, knowing that whatever is unfinished will be finished.

I am reminded that the Pony Express was a success because at those 157 relay stations there were stable hands, and cooks, and many others to assist.

I thank all those who assisted me and truly hope you will continue to help Debbie as I dismount from my pony.

Encouraging ALL directors to engage and involve members on the various avenues of service.


The club board is going to take away these ideas and come up with a new-look program that will be very different from club meetings in the past.
