

Golf Day Raises \$4000 for Cancer

Tonight was a celebration & presentation to the Cancer Council with the golf day proceeds. Thanks to so many great sponsors & members who assisted with the days events. Special guests were - the CEO of PMQ Golf Club Ian Munro & the 2IC Lauren Rayner, Kirsty Baxter & Natalie Schmidt from the MNC Cancer Institute and Cherie Rayner & Samantha from the Sunset Gallery as well as a number of Rotarians & partners.

The Mid North Coast Cancer Institute (which is next to the Base Hospital) has 122 nurses and health workers. They do radiation therapy with two linac, care for outpatients, conduct clinics and have a treatment room with 12 chairs (they need 21 @ \$8000 a chair). The cancer clinic is so grateful for the near proximity of Rotary

Bookshop - a look behind the counter

For the past two weeks, Tony Moore, Julie Medway and myself have been looking after the Rotary bookshop whilst Valda Sturrock & Bob Cleland have had a well-deserved holiday.

The bookshop involves a lot of work which Valda & Bob handle week-on-week spending hours & hours doing bookshop stuff. Club members help on Saturdays & at book-sorting days. Last year during Covid our club's main source of income was over \$70,000, the bulk of which came for the sale of second-hand books at the bookshop and at our Giant Book Sale. This provided a great source of funding which our club was able to distribute to local & overseas charities, such as the Nepal Mothers & Babies Hospital, Debbie's Dunnies & Rotary International causes like Ending Polio & Combatting Malaria, to name just a few.


To give an example of an average week at the bookshop. On Friday afternoon we arrived at the bookshop to find 14 boxes of books on the verandah. These were sorted, shelves stacked & boxes filled for storage.

Saturday from 9am - 1pm the bookshop was open & whilst customers were not many (30 customers bought \$428-50 worth of books) we were flooded with books delivered from the community.

Hundreds. At one stage we had 6 crates loaded with books & 8 boxes from Dahlsford, all wanting their crates & boxes back. The sorting floor was awash with books!

Valda does a great job in helping people find books & keeps a list. We managed to find three books for three grateful customers who had their books on order, hoping for them to come in to the bookshop....... Kerry Medway

A big shout-out to Phil Perry, who manages the Rotary Community Centre, takes pallets of books into storage & arranges for the dumpster to be emptied when full.
