Next weeks Port Wheel will be edited by our President Debbie Loveday who is also Assistant Editor. Should be a good one.

The Committee has been trying to meet with a Landscape Architect to upgrade the park entrance since October last year. Kate Whatman, the Landscape Architect who came showed us her plan and surprisingly it was not very different to the 2008 Master Plan that we assisted with. The children's playground, shelter sheds and path across the park will remain. The Observatory will have an added small coffee shop and some angle parking for about 15 cars opposite Lions Park. The large shelter shed near the beach entry end will be moved back to allow for safer maneuverability on that very busy intersection. There will be a path around the whole park and there will be a safer beach access across Stewart Street plus two large shakanes on that Street to slow traffic down. The Rotary memorials on old seats will be transferred to new seats. The park entrance will remain in its present location but it's orientation will face the roundabout and there will be a change of planting.

After discussion with us the Council Architect is going to rethink the park entrance but we did insist on the Rotary Park Meeting board remaining.

We asked for the addition of a Yarning Circle in the park. A Yarning Circle is presently being added to many school grounds and as the Observatory is anticipating more school and university tours a Yarning Circle would be of great benefit and allow groups to sit around and discuss what they have seen. Most likely use sandstone blocks if agreed. They agreed to talk to "Uncle Bill" & the Birapi people.

Both clubs acknowledged that we would like the Council to take over the gardening maintenance. It is important that we look at the park plans when available and submit a combined club response on what we want to see happen. Thanks Lorryl.
