## Dr Ted Giblin—Bio Blitz, An Interview with Costa



Tonight we heard from Dr Ted about the planned Bio Blitz for next May 2023. It will involve experts in botany, biology, ornithology, herpetology, and other disciplines, including citizen scientists from Charles Sturt University, PMQ schools and the PMQ community. A BioBlitz is an event that focuses on finding and identifying as many species as possible in a specific area over a short period of time. They are an opportunity to take a snapshot of the biodiversity of a place.

Students, scientists, naturalists, and community members join together in these events to explore the natural world.

Participants of all ages can learn techniques for observing and collecting plant and animal data within a designated area and time frame.

## SCIENTIFIC DATA COLLECTION

BioBlitzes offer an opportunity to develop and expand on existing data sets. Participants can collect enormous quantities of local species and biodiversity data. They can even lead to discovery of species not previously observed in an area, or new species to science!

## LOCAL COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

It is imperative that children and adults are involved from our local community. We need maximum exposure to all areas. The focus is not on science, biodiversity, or climate change, but on a Community FUN Event
