This year, Julie and I had the thrill of leading a CFT tour to Germany for three weeks. Among many hi-lites was crossing over the border to Salzburg in Austria. We visited a little town called Obernorf near Salzburg where the

Christmas Carol "Silent Night" was first sung. As Christmas approached in 1818, the local priest Joseph Moir found that his church organ was broken. He had written a verse and asked the local schoolteacher Franz Gruber if he could

compose a tune suitable for playing on a guitar. So on Christmas Eve "Silent Night" was first sung in the little chapel.

One of the members of our tour knew a little German & she wrote the first verse in German onto our song-sheets. We checked the translation & pronunciation with our German tour guide and met in the restored front of the 1818 chapel and sang in both German & English the first verse of "Silent Night". It was a

'goosebump' experience.

It's ironic that the first Christmas night was anything but guiet - firstly Bethlehem was abuzz with lots of visitors having come for the census. Secondly, the baby Jesus was born in a stable sharing the space with noisy sheep, goats and cows! (And Mary's birth screams..thanks Robbie Giblin) I tried to sleep in a shearing shed full of sheep some years ago near Coober Pedy. During the night, the sheep bleated and stamped their feet repeatedly. I and my friends left the shed before midnight and slept outside on the ground.

Thirdly, we read in Luke chapter 2, that down the road from the stable in

Bethlehem, a group of shepherds were woken by a loud chorus of angels singing - "Glory to God on the highest and peace on earth.. "These shepherds left their sheep and toddled up the road to see what had happened in the local Inn's stable.
