Des Kennedy- Momentum Australia

Tonight we were delighted to host Des Kennedy and Paul Hazelgrove from Momentum Australia. Des emigrated from Belfast, Northern Ireland in 1981. His career has taken him from the Head of NRMA Technology, to being the General Manager (Global), IT Infrastructure, Qantas, to being the Global Head of Technology, Fonterra and to being the projects Director for Deutche Bank, NT Government



There are many statistics online which identify the plight of many men in our society. This situation not only affects men who have no faith but can also impact men who have faith in God. Many men have lost their identity, their self-esteem, their perspective on a balanced life that is fruitful, balanced, and useful.

Des describes himself as a 'Prodigal Son', growing up in a loving Christian environment, but rejecting that life to find his own way in life. Some would call his life successful, however, Des looks back with regret on wasted years, on being a failed dad, and husband, and on finding faith in Jesus, how his life has turned around and is now focussed on serving others, particularly men.

Momentum is a Christian—based ministry that invests into the lives of all men. In their search for identity, meaning, and in order to numb emotional pain, men turn to the wrong things to fill the void. It is activity based, providing opportunities and safe environments for men to socialise in a friendly, proactive way. They get alongside men on their journey and help them t live their best lives as fathers, husbands, sons, brothers and friends in authentic relationships.

Momentum is a weekly pre recorded half hour radio show that is broadcast In 35 cities and towns all around Australia. It is also a weekly podcast, that is gaining both a national and international al audience. To date they have received notifications from over 35 countries overseas. Each week the show explores a topic that is relevant to men, inviting experts to bring awareness and background to offer solutions and keys to assist men in an area.

Within the radio show, podcast and communities, Momentum encourages, confidentiality, honesty, No condemnation, openness, positivity, reality, respect, safety and trust. Its core subjects are Identity, Faith, Husband hood, Fatherhood, Camaraderie/ Church, Alcohol, Depression and Suicide, Drugs, Gambling, Pornography and Financial Stewardship. Thanks Des for a most informative talk about the inspiring work that you do in our communities.

Deb Tougher - gave us an update tonight on the homeless housing being completed in Kempsey. She was proud to let us know that there are three cabins nearly completed. If that wasn't good news enough, they have been successful in acquiring a large government grant of \$500K to finish 10 of the cabins and put in the infrastructure to ensure its sustainability. Deb has been preparing for the "YPS Hike for Homeless " Warrumbungles Challenge.

Deb spoke about "Our Place", a drop in service for all those in the community doing it tough.

EARTHQUAKE IN TURKEY—Rotary Responds

Turkey and Syria were struck by a devastating earthquake on 6 February that has killed tens of thousands of people, destroyed thousands of homes and other structures, and

left people across the region without shelter in bitterly cold winter weather. **Pic**ture right is Rotary Turkey responding with shelter and hope.

The Rotary world responded to this catastrophe immediately. RI President Jennifer Jones activated our disaster response efforts, communicated with the affected districts, and encouraged governors in those regions to apply for disaster response grants and share information about their relief efforts so that Rotary can amplify the calls for support.



Rotary's project partner ShelterBox has an emergency response team assessing the needs in the region and how it can respond. That team is communicating with Rotary district leaders. Our service partner Habitat for Humanity International is also working on its response.
