In keeping with Club President Ray's Environmental Focus, tonight's guest speaker was Leon Carle who is the Biodiversity Officer for the Hastings Amateur Beekeepers. Leon shared on the importance of pollination and why bees are important to our Agri Industry. He also spoke about the

recent devastation caused by a mite that has had a serious impact on bees in Australia.

After much difficulty setting up the laptop for Leon to show his pictures as he talked and problems with the microphone, we finally got Leon under way.

Leon kept us enthralled with an interesting talk with many fascinating facts about BEES and beekeepers. One interesting fact - did you know honey is the only food that has no expiry date!!! They have found jars of honey sealed in jars from 2000 years ago!

The bee industry in Australia is under threat from a Verroa Mite that was first detected on the docks at Newcastle and is now

spreading and destroying millions of bees around NSW. If this virus continues unchecked then millions of bees will die, beekeepers will decrease and the cost of honey and wax will escalate.

To eradicate this mite attack, beekeepers are being told to wash 300 bees from their hives every 16 weeks in alcohol. This will expose the mite and hopefully lead to its eradication. The whole of our agricultural economy depends on this happening!
