

Hope for Young Mothers Project—Uganda

I am pleased to announce that our Hope For Young Mothers Project in partnership with PP Henry Nsamba of the Rotary Club of Kampala Kawempe has been registered with RAWCS

Rotary Club Kampala Kawempe, in partnership with the community leadership and other local organizations, will implement an empowerment and livelihood project in the slums of Kawempe with the aim of improving the employability capacity and life skills and resettlement of the young mothers in slums.

The Project will utilize the Directorate of Industri-



al Training (DIT) modular training resource ma-terials and their assessment personnel for quality assurance. This partnership will ensure Certification of the youth for recognition of their competitiveness in the labor market. The Club will develop a useful sensitization strategy for these youth to tackle negative social behaviors and mind-set chance within

their communities Training equipment such as computers, sewing machines will be procured .The beneficiaries will be selected in collaboration with local leaders and will choose from the following vocational training programs; tailoring, hair braiding, cookery, computer skilling, reusable pads production, soap production and all will be tak-

en through life skills, fields of their preference. Sensitizations will be undertaken to change mind -sets of youth from peer group harmful habits such as drug abuse, prostitution, and defilement. The Committee will be set up to ensure smooth running and continuity.


