### Hope for Young Mothers in Uganda


Our club was successful in obtaining a District Grant of \$4250 (plus \$2000 sent directly from our club funds) to support a Rotary Project via RAWCs with the R/C of

Rotary Project via RAWCs with the R/C of Kampala Kawempe, Uganda in partnership with community leadership to empower young mothers in the slums of

Kawempe aiming to improve the employability & life skills & resettlement of young mothers.

Working with Rotary PP Henry Nsamba said this project will utilise Industrial Training & materials & provide computers, sewing machines & vocational training in hair braiding, cookery, computer skills & production of reusable pads.

This project is to empower young mothers to rise above the despair of their hopeless circumstances & make something of their lives for themselves & their young babies/children.



We were saddened to here that in January a former member of our club - Russell Holland died. Russell had moved to Qld to be close to family. We are not sure of the circumstances of his death nor funeral.



Russell was a member of our club in 2011-12 & 2013-17. He worked tirelessly alongside now Honorary Member Ray White in constructing our Rotary Community Centre extensions which now houses our Rotary Bookshop.

Russell also travelled with Ray to the island of Tanna in Vanuatu & assisted in the rebuilding of schools and the local hospital working on various RAWCs projects.

He was a great man to turn for advise in ourmany building projects both here and on Tanna.


Russell did not like attending Rotary dinner meetings, he was a 'hands-on Rotarian'. We remember him with thanks.
