Tonight's meeting was a vocational visit to St Thomas Church, Port Macquarie, hosted by our very own Lorryl Rumble. Lorryl is the Archivist, and she says that in this role she is also the Curator of the church's historic collection. Lorrly used to be the Parish Clerk until 2016 and during her time in that position she became aware of all the heritage letters and artifacts lying around I dusty old cupboards. She then set about designing a database, bullied church people into building her an archive

room, so she could learn the role. Lorryl is also the Chairperson of the Conservation & Heritage committee, which looks

after the buildings. After 8 years and much dedication and hard work Lorryl stills signs herself as the Archivist. Her greatest moment was having Dr Roslyn Russell (Museum Services) from the National Library assess the scope/content of the collection and identify it as nationally significant to Australia.

Excellent work Lorryl! What an achievement. We commend you on your passion and perseverance to preserve our local

history and historical artifacts.

St Thomas' Anglican

Church, its site and associated buildings is an item of State heritage significance as one of the earliest examples in Australia and has associations with the penal settlement which it served. Built to instructions from Governor Brisbane, the site having been select-



ed by Governor

Macquarie and completed during the term of <u>Governor Darling</u>, it is one of the few remaining buildings dating from the convict period constructed prior to rearrangement of the plan of the township in 1831. It demonstrates the longevity of the Anglican faith in the Port Macquarie's area and Hastings Valley region

since the area was established as a secondary convict settlement in 1821. The site with the

Church, the associated buildings, and the landscape, forms an important focus in the Port Macquarie townscape and is linked with its formation, continued growth and development. The significance of the place is enhanced by its landmark setting, and by its age and the intactness of much of the convict built

fabric. The site holds high potential for archaeological research and understanding (Wikipedia 14Mar24)



World water day 22nd march 2024

Safe drinking-water, sanitation and hygiene are crucial to human health and wellbeing. Safe WASH is not only a prerequisite to health, but contributes to livelihoods, school attendance and dignity and helps to create resilient communities living in healthy environments.

Drinking unsafe water impairs health through illnesses such as diarrhoea, and untreated excreta contaminates groundwaters and surface waters used for drinking-water, irrigation, bathing and household purposes.

Chemical contamination of water continues to pose a health burden, whether natural in origin such as arsenic and fluoride, or anthropogenic such as nitrate. Safe and sufficient WASH plays a key role in preventing numerous NTDs such as trachoma, soil-transmitted helminths and schistosomiasis. Diarrhoeal deaths as a result of inadequate WASH were reduced by half during the Millennium Development Goal (MDG) period (1990–2015), with the significant progress on water and sanitation provision playing a key role.

Evidence suggests that improving service levels towards safely managed drinking -water or sanitation such as regulated piped water or connections to sewers with wastewater treatment can dramatically improve health by reducing diarrhoeal disease deaths. World Water Day fact sheet can be accessed at
