PP Rotarian Henry gave an inspiring & challenging presentation of the work our club has supported on HOPE FOR YOUNG MOTHERS.



Kampala Kawempe is a town of 262,000 people. The town is mostly slums & devastating poor living conditions. 82% of the population are young mothers, there is 68% unemployment & prostitution is rampant on the streets.

PP Henry & the R/C of Kampala Kawempe have created a positive program of assisting young mothers in training them in life & practical skills such as sewing/tailoring, making reusable sanitary pads, liquid soap, etc. They have the capacity for 100 women in the classes. Some have to drop out, but there is a long list of other women waiting to grasp a chance for their future. Because many of these young women have worked as prostitutes there are many moral & health issues for them to overcome.

Rotarians hold a weekly breakfast for Mothers to Mothers where a Rotarian speaks to the women about life matters. Other Rotarians & members of the community from the church & council also assist.

Our club & a District Grant gave an initial grant of \$5000. It is envisaged we will contribute again to this successful project ably run by Henry & Ugandan Rotarians.

A report from Diana Gammon

"The R/C of PMQ is approaching its second year of significant environmental projects since placing a special Environmental Service Director within the Board of Directors. The First BioBlitz program was held in May 2023. The Second BioBlitz program will be held at Shelley Beach on Thursday 16th May and Friday 17th May, 2024. Preparation is well under way.

The first Dunbogan tree planting was to assist the Rotary Young Leaders' first project in 2022. The next Rotary tree planting of koala seedlings at Dunbogan is on Sunday morning 21st April, 2024. The seedlings have been under attack by swamp wallabies and need some star pickets for protection. This operation will probably take only a couple of hours as the seedlings are small.

With some Rotary planters on hand and a few friends we should be finished around 11.00 depending on numbers planting the 50 small seedlings and protection (star pickets). Andy and Nette have invited us to retire to what is known as "The Shed" a little further along the road where they will supply a tea and coffee. The Koala Hospital is giving Rotary 100 free seedlings as a contribution but those will arrive in May. (We have not offered to plant them!!!!!.)

As background, the range of the Dunbogan Koalas is restricted by the ocean, the Camden Haven River, and a lack of habitat to the south. This has geographically isolated the colony on the peninsula and consequently it has developed its own unique blueprint.

Please let Secretary Debbie know if you are coming. Hope to see you there, don't forget your hat and water."
