Brittani's Nepal Chickens

Chicken Farming Project

Tonight's guest speaker was our own club member Brittani Michelle who shared with us about her Chicken Project in Nepal.

Brittani shared that in 2018 she travelled to Nepal

to teach some English at Dhulikhel Primary School. While she was there she visited a school located in Chulthada village. She noticed there were not many children attending the school. She found out that this was due to poverty within the village as the children were having to work at markets and bus stops to provide income to their families.

Upon her return, Brittani funded a 'lunch-time' project for the children where if they attended school they would be fed a nutritious meal. This project lasted 12 months whilst Brittanie developed a sustainable solution which became the Chulthedada Chicken Project.

Travelling back to Nepal in 2019 Brittani established this chicken project. Over 2000 chickens, plus coops, water buckets and feed were delivered to the villagers. They also were asked to attend an educational workshop about chicken farming. The goal for the chicken farming was to breed chickens to lay eggs that could be sold locally at market for income. When the chickens started reproducing they could also be sold for meat. The eggs were sold and eaten within the families and the chickens continued to breed.

The overall goal for this project was to release some of the financial pressure within the village, through boosting their economy so the children were able to attend school and be educated. School attendance rose to over 80% within 6 months of the program being implemented.

Fast forward 5 years to 2024 and the chickens are still breeding and the project is still active. Many of the children who were attending school are now in college and the next generation of children are benefiting from the Chulthedada Chicken Project.

Well done Brittani.

Two of our club members are currently overseas - Rob Dalla Costa & Ross Nancarrow & Frank Gaukroger is on his fishing spree in Queensland


